

CHAPLAINCY REPORT TO THE ARCHDEANERY SYNOD

Anglican Chaplaincy Caen 2017

Chaplaincy events since May 2016

Regular Eucharist services were held until June 5th 2016 and started again on 4th September.

May 28th 2016 saw the marriage blessing of Benjamin and Anne-Sophie Heeks led by Yvonnice Bouche under the supervision of Fr. Robert Lloyd-Richards. Benjamin passed away on June 4th having received the Extreme Unction from Fr. Varty two days earlier.

On 17th June, for the 950th Anniversary of L'Abbaye aux Dames, the Choir from St. George's sang Ecumenical Vespers with the presence of the Archdeacon of Exeter, Ian Chandler and Fr. Matthew; Père Bertout felt that a similar ecumenical event with the Choir should become a regular annual event. This service was followed on Saturday 18th with a Concert of Sacred Music sung by St. George's Choir at the Abbaye aux Hommes and on Sunday 19th by a Sung Eucharist at the Chapelle de La Miséricorde with Frs. Rob Varty, Robert Lloyd-Richards and Douglas Emmott.

A Scripture Study/Exchange Time, held on Sundays before the service, began on October 9th.

The Chaplaincy welcomed Fr. Douglas Emmott as part of the clergy serving Caen when he took his first service on Sunday 23rd October. So we now have 5 priests who serve us.

Sunday December 11th saw Yvonnice Bouche representing the Chaplaincy at the Ecumenical Reception of the Peace Light of Bethlehem at the Church of St. Jean; it was also the evening for the Carol Service in the Chapelle with the Choir of St. George's. F. Matthew Harrison, Père Berthout (Head priest of Paroisse de la Sainte Trinité - Caen city centre) and Pasteur Nyangono (of the Eglise Protestante Unie de France) participated in the service. The attendance was down on the previous year's and it was suggested that better advertising be made for the Carol Service this year.

Christian Unity Week was celebrated with an Ecumenical Service at the Temple of the Eglise Protestante Unie on Sunday January 22nd 2017.
