






No Change in Spending plans for 2024




2024 EXPENDITURE

a third of Anglicans

do not give to their Church

How different to that is the Diocese in Europe??





40% of Anglicans have

never been asked to give regularly

BIG EMPHASIS HERE IS ON REGULARLY





nearly half of Anglicans have never been

asked to review their giving





Only half (53%) of Anglicans have heard a sermon on giving in the past 12 months...

and 60% of those who had, said it

didn't change their thinking on giving





less than a third

of Anglicans say they are regularly thanked

for their giving





The most popular motivation for giving for Anglicans is

to help keep the building maintained





twice as many Anglicans were asked to give by

collection envelope (60%)

compared to

direct debit (31%)





Anglicans are three times as likely to

leave a legacy to Charity than they are

to their Church





only 27% of Anglicans view their church's financial need as

'very important'





49% of Anglicans feel they would be motivated to

give more if they understood

the impact of their giving





Recommendations



Enable and encourage giving in a variety of

different ways and using different methods,

particularly digitally





Provide information about why **legacies** are needed and encourage members to consider this form of giving

Challenges for DiE

- Not all the messages fit but some certainly do
- Technical solutions such as Direct Debit, Gift Aid, Contactless, Online links etc
- Regular giving vs regular attendance
- National tax regimes etc Legacy giving
- Taking this work forward

Updating ...

- We're updating our current diocesan website. Range of 100+ web stories last year is good news.

- Safeguarding section content/look is the current priority.

Upgrading ...

- AllChurches support will part fund a new website.
- Easier, Simpler, Cleaner: easier to find resources, simpler and cleaner layout, and a search engine we can use ...
- Not "coming soon" ... but review, scoping and new requirements work due to start by early Autumn.
- Clear objective set: a new website during 2022



Building up ...

- Online diocesan publications, social media and video and comms networks
- European Anglicans and e-News
- Facebook and Instagram re-launched, Sep 20. Popular in this Archdeaconry.

- Comms network for chaplaincy comms leads



Training ...

- More social media and Zoom training for the diocese.
- 4 sessions in 2019; 5 sessions in Nov/Dec 2020 covering Zoom, Facebook, Instagram, A Church Near You, Twitter and social media planning for chaplaincies.
- More training sessions this year.
