

- Use Carbon360 as the Basis to Create/ Model a "Scientifically Based" Carbon Footprint for the DiE (Mar 2026)
- Enhance the Environmental Plan to include the RoadMap to Net Zero including Annual Targets (May 2026)
- Produce Costings so that we Have a Fully Costed Programme of Work out to 5 Years (May 2026)
- Introduce Dashboards into Reporting to improve Understanding (Feb 2026)

2.5 Chaplaincies engage with EcoChurch/Eglise Verte award programme; register, review requirements, make and implement action plan for relevant target level, supported by advice and webinars. # Where to Find Funding for Your Projects

- **The Funding Officer**
  - National Programme Focus
  - Applied for National Programme Funding to support extension of Role
- **Inputs (What do you Need to Do?)**
  - Your Carbon data entered through the Carbon360 Tool ( a prerequisite for a lot of Grant Funding)
  - Energy Audits
  - Action Plans targeted to Reduce the Carbon Footprint but also look at how it supports Mission, Community, and Cost Reduction
- **Building a Portfolio of Funding Sources (Working with you!)**
  - We categorise Projects by Scale from Small through to Major Projects
  - Grant Management
    - Sources
    - Matching the scale of your projects
    - Developing your Church Business Cases
    - Supporting your Bids for Funding
