

SUMMARY OF OUTPUTS FROM SAFEGUARDING WORKSHOP

The following issues were highlighted in the Safeguarding Workshop:

Level 3 Safeguarding Training

This training will be for people who lead worship.
This will be available soon but is not available yet.

Notification of Safeguarding Training Courses

The normal procedure is that the Archdeacon's Office will notify Chaplains when new dates for courses become available, and the Chaplain then works with their own Safeguarding Team to identify people who might attend.

GDPR Data Subject Access Requests (DSAR's) and Safeguarding Cases

Once a Safeguarding Case has been closed, it is possible for anyone connected with the case to make a DSAR to the Diocesan Safeguarding Team (or the local Chaplaincy Safeguarding Officer). This can be a very sensitive matter. The Safeguarding Team confirmed that they have procedures in place to manage DSAR's in these circumstances, including redaction of other people's personal data where appropriate.

Safeguarding Training Team in France

There are now 8 Safeguarding Trainers in France.

Safeguarding in buildings owned by a Chaplaincy and shared with other groups

Where other groups are sharing a Chaplaincy building, they may work under their own safeguarding policies provided that these are as robust as the Diocese's. Otherwise, the group must be required to adhere to Diocesan policies.
