It is a tribute to our congregation that throughout the last years the attendance and giving has remained fairly stable and if anything the number and breadth of our activities has increased. However, now we are embarking on a new phase which promises much.

The installation service just before Christmas mirrored the rich diversity of our congregation and was a template for inclusiveness with African drums, a Malgache Gloria and a line up of members of the congregation offering symbols of our worship and work to Mark.

Our life as a Chaplaincy is centered on the Sunday Eucharist. We have a thriving Sunday school, an energetic caritative association which raises a sum equivalent to 8% of our income for projects in both Strasbourg and overseas, groups for Bible study and prayer and weekends away from Strasbourg for recreation, fun, study and worship.
